5. Why are there such specific instructions about the preparation of the meal?

6. Why are they to eat it as stated in verse 11?

7. Why are the Israelites not automatically protected from this plague?

8. What do you think the tone was in Israelite houses that night?

9. Why were the Israelites to keep the observance of Passover?



10. Read Luke 22:14-20. How does Jesus change the Passover meal and its significance?

11. Read 1 Corinthians 11:17-34. How is the 'Passover' meal to be commemorated now?

12. How would you know if the blood of Jesus is on the doorposts of your life?



13. When sharing in the modern Passover, what may stop us from sharing in it biblically?

14. Belonging to the people of God didn't count when it came to Passover. In what way do people/you belong and not believe? What dangers are there in this?
